LENT... 'Dialogue with Jesus – Becoming more the Body of Christ!'

Dear Friends,

'Is the Lord with us or not?' When life knocks us around or our world becomes so troubled or confused as it presently is, we find it difficult to cope and may be tempted to ask that question. Deep down, it's probably a faith question as we find yourself struggling with our emotional responses to the various disasters, crises and life challenges.

We need to remember that our combined, Lenten efforts at personal change and outreach to others bring about real change beyond ourselves in the family, community and wider Church. Consider the dialogue between Jesus and the Samaritan woman, a powerful encounter which reveals the forgiving, welcoming nature of Jesus who helps her move beyond her defensiveness and ultimately witness to Jesus among her own community – *Could this be the Christ?*

Stories like this and many others in Jesus' life model his unconditional love and patience with those who are on the edge. A recent article by Andrea Tornielli quoted a 1981 homily of then Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger (later Pope Benedict XVI) speaking about St Monica, mother of St Augustine: *'Suffering, Monica learned to let him walk his own road, without constraints. She learned to endure that his road was altogether different from the one she had imagined for him.'*

Monica's attitude toward her son was *'the personification of the ecclesial community: a space of life, of welcome, of freedom, where each person's freedom is respected and faith is never imposed,'* she writes. This is the delicate space in which the families of our children preparing for the Sacrament of First Reconciliation find themselves – the invitation to walk gently with their sons and daughters, to invite them to move forward in faith, and as parents to grow in faith themselves.

As a Parish Community, we make an effort to offer the face of a welcoming Church where everyone's freedom and timing are respected. I have often heard it said that we are a welcoming community, a strong identity to have. Even then, there are some who feel neglected, unnoticed, on the fringe – perhaps not unlike the Samaritan woman in her emptiness and separation.

A way of engaging with Lent is to look for life-giving ways of observing the traditional Lenten disciplines of prayer, almsgiving and self-denial – perhaps **fasting** from worrying, apathy, and our own greed, and **feasting** on trusting, enthusiasm and simplicity. This prayer may help:

Spirit of God, who led Jesus into the desert to fast and pray, lead us as we journey through this time of Lent. Give us courage to scrutinise our hearts with honesty and reach out to those in need.

Give us love to forgive ourselves and each other, so that, in peace and joy, we may celebrate at Easter the death and resurrection of Jesus and all make this prayer in Jesus' name.

Yet, I know that understanding and good intentions are worthless, unless rooted in your graceful love. Gospel: JOHN 4:5-42

⁵ On the way he came to the Samaritan town called Sychar near the land that Jacob gave to his son Joseph. ⁶ Jacob's well was there and Jesus, tired by the journey, sat down by the well. It was about the sixth hour. ⁷ When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, 'Give me something to drink.' ⁸ His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. ⁹ The Samaritan woman said to him, 'You are a Jew. How is it that you ask me, a Samaritan, for something to drink?' - Jews, of course, do not associate with Samaritans. ¹⁰ Jesus replied to her:

'If you only knew what God is offering and who it is that is saying to you, Give me something to drink, you would have been the one to ask, and he would have given you living water.'

¹¹ 'You have no bucket, sir,' she answered, 'and the well is deep: how do you get this living water?' ¹² Are you a greater man than our father Jacob, who gave us this well and drank from it himself with his sons and his cattle?' ¹³ Jesus replied: Whoever drinks this water will be thirsty again; ¹⁴ but no one who drinks the water that I shall give will ever be thirsty again: the water that I shall give will become a spring of water within, welling up for eternal life.

¹⁵ 'Sir,' said the woman, 'give me some of that water, so that I may never be thirsty or come here again to draw water.'

¹⁶ 'Go and call your husband,' said Jesus to her, 'and come back here.'

¹⁷ The woman answered, 'I have no husband.' Jesus said to her, 'You are right to say, "I have no husband"; ¹⁸ for although you have had five, the one you now have is not your husband. You spoke the truth there.'

¹⁹ 'I see you are a prophet, sir,' said the woman. ²⁰ 'Our fathers worshipped on this mountain, though you say that Jerusalem is the place where one ought to worship.'

²¹ Jesus said: Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. ²² You worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know; for salvation comes from the Jews. ²³ But the hour is coming - indeed it is already here - when true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth: that is the kind of worshipper the Father seeks. ²⁴ God is spirit, and those who worship must worship in spirit and truth.

²⁵ The woman said to him, 'I know that Messiah - that is, Christ - is coming; and when he comes he will explain everything.'

²⁶ Jesus said, 'That is who I am, I who speak to you.'

²⁷ At this point his disciples returned and were surprised to find him speaking to a woman, though none of them asked, 'What do you want from her?' or, 'What are you talking to her about?'

²⁸ The woman put down her water jar and hurried back to the town to tell the people, ²⁹ 'Come and see a man who has told me everything I have done; could this be the Christ?'

³⁰ This brought people out of the town and they made their way towards him. ³¹ Meanwhile, the disciples were urging him, 'Rabbi, do have something to eat'; ³² but he said, 'I have food to eat that you do not know about.' ³³ So the disciples said to one another, 'Has someone brought him food?' ³⁴ But Jesus said:

My food is to do the will of the one who sent me, and to complete his work. ³⁵ Do you not have a saying: Four months and then the harvest? Well, I tell you, look around you, look at the fields; already they are white, ready for harvest! ³⁶ Already the reaper is being paid his wages, already he is bringing in the grain for eternal life, so that sower and reaper can rejoice together. ³⁷ For here the proverb holds true: one sows, another reaps; ³⁸ I sent you to reap a harvest you have not laboured for. Others have laboured for it; and you have come into the rewards of their labour. ³⁹ Many Samaritans of that town believed in him on the strength of the woman's words of testimony, 'He told me everything I have done.' ⁴⁰ So, when the Samaritans came up to him, they begged him to stay with them. He stayed for two days, and ⁴¹ many more came to believe on the strength of the words he spoke to them; ⁴² and they said to the woman, 'Now we believe no longer because of what you told us; we have heard him ourselves and we know that he is indeed the Saviour of the world.'

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Today we are greatly helped by the wonderful Gospel of the Woman at the Well. On the third attempt, Jesus finally gets through to her but after that there is no stopping her. As Augustine teaches, she represents us:

what do I thirst for? What is the most important thing in my life? Where do I now find God? By relentless challenge and resolute honesty, we too can be led to that encounter with Jesus, which changes everything, "giving life a new horizon and a decisive direction." May we come to believe because we have heard him ourselves and we know that he really is the saviour of the world.

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. Jesus leads the woman along a wonderful journey towards a deeper and fuller life. You can enter the story with Jesus, the ideal leader, parent, teacher, or spiritual guide. Notice how he meets the woman where she is, needing her assistance, how he is patient with her, but also challenges her to grow to what she is capable of. Perhaps you have been such a teacher, or you can recall people who were.
2. You can also enter the story from the perspective of the woman's journey. Notice the steps along the way: suspicion, distrust, curiosity, misunderstanding and conversion. Her journey was one in which a very human motivation attracted her to Jesus: the thought of having water in such a way that she did not have to come and draw it from the well. What have been the human motives that have attracted you to faith, prayer, religion, church and which have been stepping-stones to a deeper personal relationship with Jesus? Perhaps we can also see the same movement in the growth of some of our human relationships.
3. The woman's final tactic is to attempt to buy time before responding (v. 25) —it will all happen sometime in the future. Jesus points out that the time for a faith response is NOW. How have you discovered the importance of the NOW moment?



MONORANJON from BANGLADESH

Monoranjon, 47, lives in a coastal village in southwest Bangladesh, one of the regions most affected by climate change. He and his family face extreme heat, cyclones, water scarcity, and rising salinity that is destroying crops and livelihoods. As a farmer and father of two, Monoranjon struggled to provide for his family and keep his daughter and son in school.

“In this dry season no seedlings come out from seeds. Due to heat of the sun and lack of water, plants are dying,” Monoranjon said.

Thanks to support from Caritas Australia and its partner Caritas Bangladesh, Monoranjon joined the Community Managed Sustainable Livelihoods and Resilience Program. He learned climate-resilient farming techniques, including organic vegetable cultivation, livestock vaccination, crab fattening, and salt-tolerant crop production. His income has improved, allowing him to send his children to school and access better nutrition. Monoranjon now teaches others in his village, inspiring change and resilience across the community.
