Easter Rising... 'Christ, my hope, is risen from death!

2ND SUNDAY of EASTER, Yr A
(DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY)

Dear Friends,

At Easter, Pope Leo proclaimed the central truth of our Christian faith – 'Christ, my hope, is risen from death!' and encouraged us: 'Let us allow our hearts to be transformed by his immense love for us!' This celebration of Christ's Resurrection reminds us of the timeless love of God and our being freed from our sinfulness.

During Lent, we don't pretend that Christ has not risen but we enter into the mystery with him and take the journey through our Lenten reflections and devotions, our attentiveness to God's Word which unpacks the powerful story of our God who continues to embrace our humanity and reassure us of our beauty in his eyes. Yet sadness in our world continues and Leo needed to add:

'Let those who have weapons lay them down! Let those who have the power to unleash wars choose peace! Not a peace imposed by force, but through dialogue! Not with the desire to dominate others, but to encounter them!'

Our world is going through a very painful time which tests both our faith and our humanity and challenges us to put our faith ahead of politics. Belief in the Resurrection does not compromise our freedom but keeps us focused on how our God has brought us out of the darkness we all feel at some time into the light, our liturgical experience of the Easter Vigil.



Our present experience in the world would resonate with Thomas, criticized for his doubting, but then Jesus' Resurrection was hardly obvious. The disciples, yet to realize this 'newness of God', thought the women's report from the tomb - 'He is not here; he is risen!' - an idle tale. For Jesus' followers, doubt can and does lead us to Faith.

Faith is a gift from God – we need to let it come. Easter is a powerful time for this, yet we do not journey alone. The Risen Lord is always close, and we need to let him come. He invites us to sit quietly and listen, experience his Mercy... 'Do not be afraid... I am the Resurrection and the Life... Do not doubt but believe... Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe!'

A few years ago, the Augustinians in the UK offered this helpful reflection: 'This year, the darkness may enable us to see the light of Christ more clearly and more urgently, to hear God's "yes" deep within our hearts and lives... If we affirm Christ risen from the dead, we are radically free to place our trust in God and not to be overwhelmed by the apparently overwhelming. We might even begin to feel the joy'.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." 20 After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. 21 Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." 22 When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. 23 If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

24 But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. 25 So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

26 A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." 27 Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." 28 Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" 29 Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

30 Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. 31 But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

Thought for the Day

How did any of us make the journey towards faith in Christ? No doubt a great part of it is simply what we received—usually from family. At some point, did I make a conscious choice? Perhaps at other times, I felt like walking away from the faith project? What kept me going? Did a more personal ownership of faith result? Perhaps I felt the intuition of John O'Donahue, "Faith is helpless attraction to the divine." In spite of everything, in spite of myself, somehow it is part of who I am.

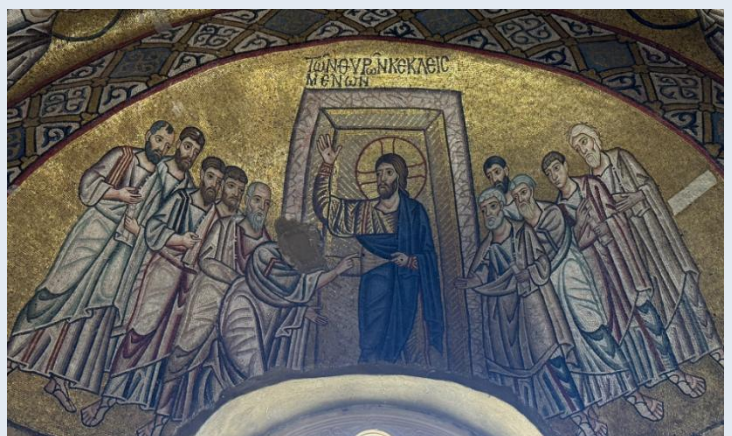
Pointers for Prayer

1. "Peace be with you" was the greeting of Jesus on meeting his frightened apostles. Who has come to you bringing peace at times when you were afraid? To whom have you been able to bring peace?
2. Thomas, doubting and questioning, is possibly a person with whom we can identify. What part have doubting and questioning played in your faith journey? How has your faith been strengthened by such moments?
3. Note the way that Jesus dealt with Thomas. He did not give out because he doubted. He accepted how he felt and led him along to see the truth of his resurrection. Who has been that kind of teacher for you, gently taking you from where you were and leading you to a deeper knowledge of some truth about life? For whom have you been that kind of teacher?
"Blessed are they who have not seen and yet believed". That requires great trust. Perhaps you have had the experience of being trusted without having to justify every step along the way. What was it like to be trusted in that way? Who have you been able to trust in a similar manner?

Prayer

God of life, source of all faith, through the waters of baptism you have raised us up in Christ and given us life that endures. Day by day, refine our faith that we who have not seen the Christ, may truly confess him as our Lord and God, and share the blessedness of those who believe. Grant this through Jesus Christ, the resurrection and the life, who lives and signs with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever.

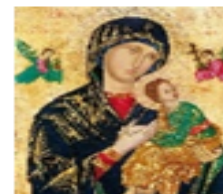

Fr Dave is very grateful to parishioners for their support and prayers.

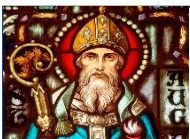
Bishop Vincent presents Archbishop Ryan Jimenez: 21 April

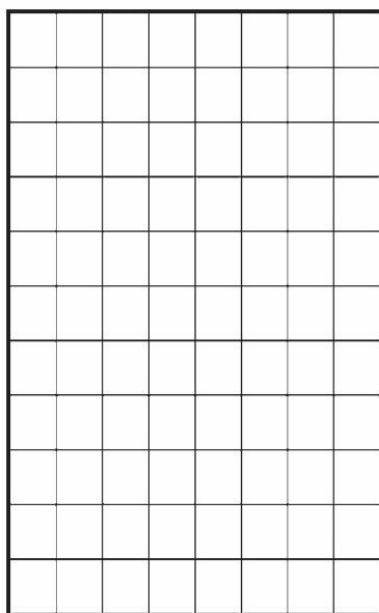
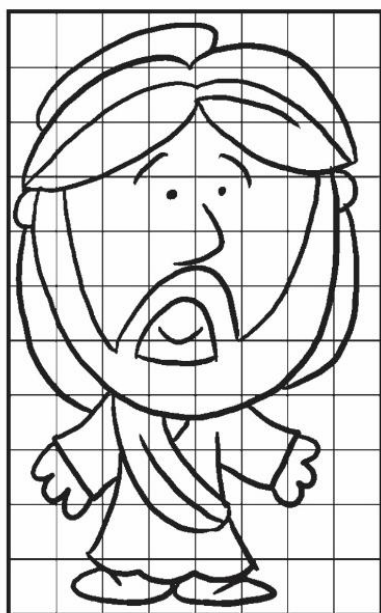
