*Christ is risen—He is truly risen! Alleluia!*

Dear Friends,

Easter proclaims to us a truth that the world longs to hear:

**hope is stronger than fear, love is stronger than sin, and life is stronger than death.**

The empty tomb is not just a sign of what happened long ago—it is a promise for us today. In a world marked by uncertainty, suffering, and division, the Risen Christ stands among us and says: **“Do not be afraid”**. Even amid conflicts—whether global or domestic—the Risen Jesus comes to us and says: **“Peace be with you”**.

Pope Leo XIV reminds us that “the peace of the risen Jesus is unarmed; His was an unarmed struggle in the midst of concrete historical, political and social circumstances.” In a time when we are confronted by the threats of conflict and its painful consequences, the Holy Father calls us to rediscover and live a peace that is truly of Christ—a **“disarmed, unarmed peace”**.

This peace is not imposed by force, but offered through love, mercy, and self-giving. It is a peace that must be lived, cultivated, and protected in our hearts, in our homes, and in our communities. For as he warns, “when peace is not a reality that is lived, cultivated and protected, *then aggression spreads into domestic and public life.*”

This message resonates deeply with the wisdom of Saint Augustine of Hippo, who reflected profoundly on the Resurrection and the peace it brings. Augustine reminds us that the Risen Christ still bears His wounds—not as signs of defeat, but as **doors of mercy**. Through these wounds, Christ heals the wounds of sin within us. The Resurrection, then, is not only victory over death—it is the **healing of humanity**, the restoration of peace within the human heart.

Easter invites us not to remain at the tomb, looking for what is past. Instead, we are called to move forward as the disciples did—

from fear to courage,  
from doubt to faith,  
from silence to joyful witness.



*On behalf of my brother Augustinians—Frs. Peter, Dave, and Saju—I encourage each one of us to receive this Easter gift of peace, Christ’s unarmed peace, and to become its bearers. In our families, may we choose understanding over anger. In our parish, may we deepen communion and charity. In our world, may we witness to hope, even in the face of difficulty.*

*May this Easter renew our hearts, strengthen our faith, and send us forth as bearers of hope and instruments of Christ’s peace. For indeed, as Saint Augustine of Hippo reminds us: “We are an Easter people, and Alleluia is our song!”*

## On the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb

### Gospel: John 20:1-9

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. 2 So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him."

3 Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. 4 The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. 5 He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. 6 Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, 7 and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. 8 Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; 9 for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. 10 Then the disciples returned to their homes.

11 But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; 12 and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. 13 They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him."

14 When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. 15 Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." 16 Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). 17 Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'"

18 Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

### Thought for the Day

Traditionally, we have found it easy to think of the cross as the measure of God's love for us. Because of the focus on the cross, we find it more difficult to think of the resurrection as also the love of God, perhaps "all the more so"! The originality of the Fourth Gospel says it all: the disciple Jesus loved, the head cloth recalling Lazarus (see how much he loved him) and, not least, the great figure of Mary Magdalene (Mary!). In summary, Jesus died and rose again for love of us. Let us be loved!

### Pointers for Prayer

1. The disciples are in a state of shock after their traumatic loss. Jesus, the one in whom they had placed so much hope, has been murdered and buried. Then, before they have time to recover they get another shock. The body of Jesus is missing. Have you had experiences in which one tragedy or crisis follows quickly after another? What was that like for you? How did you cope? Who, or what, sustained you?
2. Mary and Peter, and the other disciple, came and discovered that the tomb was empty. In this text no explanation is given. They are left in a state of bewilderment 'for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead'. Have you been in situations, faced with events you cannot explain, possibly events that have dashed your hopes in another person, or in God? What has that been like for you?
3. Yet in spite of the lack of explanation, the beloved disciple 'saw and believed'. Have there been times when others have done something that you could not understand, and which they could not explain at the time, and yet you believed that all was not as it seemed; times when you decided to trust in spite of the evidence? Have there been times when others have shown this kind of faith in you, when you were not able to offer satisfactory explanations, and all you could say was 'trust me'?
4. Have there been times in your relationship with God when you have felt that you were faced with an empty tomb, and still you believed? What have you learned about life, about love, from such experiences?

### Prayer

Loving God, you love us more than we can imagine or take in. Help us to allow ourselves to be so loved by you, that your love may penetrate our hearts, our lives and our loves. We ask this through Jesus, who died and rose for love of us and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

## **PRIOR PROVINCIAL ELECT (2026–2030)**

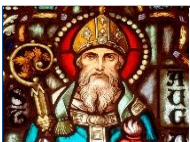
We are pleased to share that Fr Anthony Banks OSA has been elected Prior Provincial of the Province of Our Mother of Good Counsel–Australasia.

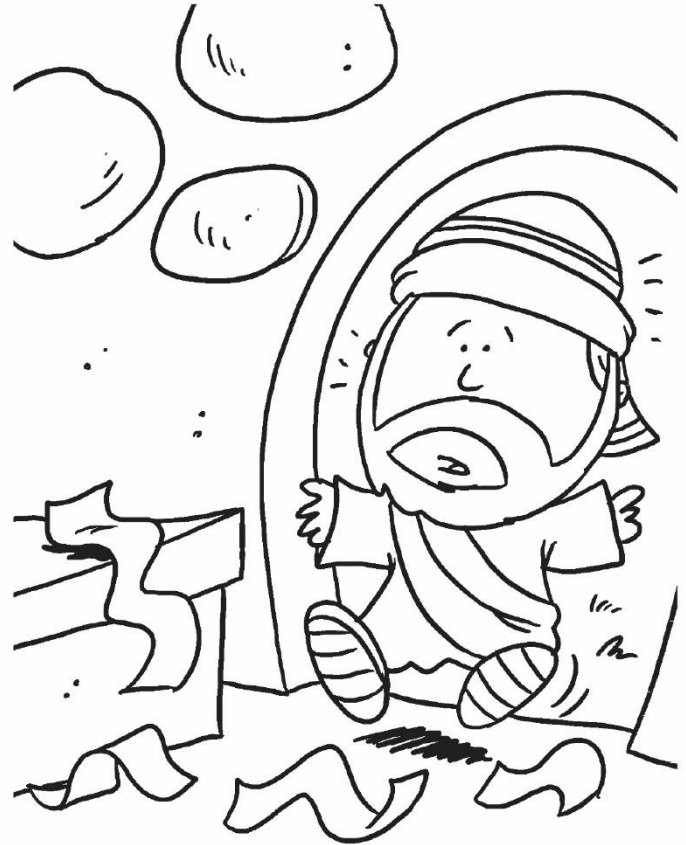


# Jesus is **RISEN** HAPPY EASTER!

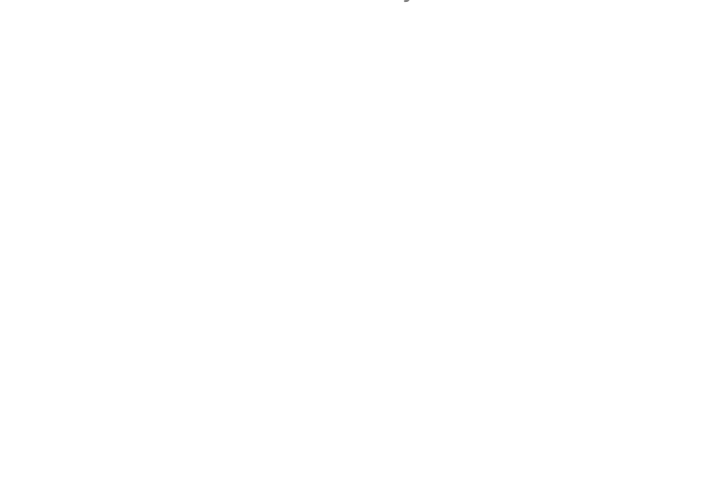
