The Trinity – ‘God shares his Life with us – Love is God!’

Dear Friends,

Each time we gather for Baptisms at Holy Spirit, I invite the families present to be aware of the many symbols that are part of the Sacrament – Water, the Oils of Catechumens and Sacred Chrism, the white baptismal garment, and the Easter Candle – and the way these are linked together through the Sign of the Cross... *Father, Son and Holy Spirit*. Baptism – the biggest Sacrament – draws us into the life of God as Trinity and gives us our unique ‘*Catholic identity*’. NAMES

Understanding the Trinity is beyond us, yet we glimpse God’s glory as we are drawn into this ‘community of God’ – our symbols help us to understand but do not weaken or destroy the mystery. At times, we encounter God’s glory in the Scriptures, particularly Jesus’ words describing his relationship with the Father and the Holy Spirit. One text I find helpful is from the first Letter of St John 4:16:

‘We have come to know and to believe in the love God has for us. God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him.’

Love is at the heart of our lives personally and as family and community – perhaps the primary means of our understanding who we are. St Augustine breaks open this reality, essentially teaching that, ‘*If God is love, then love is God!*’ Even those who do not know God are somehow connected with God through the shared, human experience of love for which we all hunger. A few of his other insights include coming to know God in our neighbour and in experiences of community such as our Parish celebration of the Holy Spirit last weekend:

God is love, John has said... John could not have recommended love more highly than to have called it God. Love is more than a gift of God. You might possibly think little of a gift of God, but you cannot think little of God himself. (Sermon on 1 John 8, 14)

If the only word in Scripture were that one word of the Holy Spirit: ‘God is love,’ it would be amply sufficient and we would need to look no further. (On 1 John 7, 4; 10, 7)

Do you think that when you love your sister and brother you are loving him or her alone and not Christ as well? That is impossible, because you are

loving the members of Christ. When you love Christ’s members, you love Christ himself. And when you love Christ, you love the Son of God. When you love the Son of God, you love the Father. Love cannot be split up. Begin loving somewhere, and the rest will follow. (Sermon on 1 John 10, 3)

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son

John 3:16-18

14 *And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, 15 that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.*

16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

17 "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. 18 Those who believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in the name of the only Son of God.

19 *And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. 20 For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed. 21 But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God."*

Thought for the Day

The Trinity is not first of all a puzzle, which in principle could be solved, but rather a mystery, a relationship which is first of all lived, never exhausted and only inadequately spoken of in words. This is true of any of the significant relationships in our lives and true, therefore, all the more so of God. Within the mystery of that relationship, we recognise God, from whom we come, in whom we live and move and have our being. We recognise the Son, the way, the truth and the life. We recognise the Spirit, who helps us to pray when we do not know how to pray as we ought.

Pointers for Prayer

1. Jesus speaks of himself being lifted up, a term that can mean a physical lifting, or also exaltation. By this play on words the evangelist explains to us that Jesus' gift of himself in the passion was a glorious revelation of love, despite all its injustice and brutality. Bring to mind occasions when the love shown by Jesus in his passion was a sacrament of God's love for you.
2. It would be very cushy for us if we could be a source of life to others without cost to ourselves. The true life-givers know that they need the generosity of being lifted up by giving their lives so that others may have life. Recall when you have had that generosity and give thanks for others who have been like that for you.
3. We receive life from God when our faith enables us to trust in God's love for us. We give life to one another when the love between us is trustworthy. Recall memories of that kind of trustworthy love. For whom have you been able to be a 'Jesus person' and give a love that another could trust? Who has shown that kind of love to you and been for you a sacrament of God's love?
4. People loved darkness rather than light...so that their deeds may not be exposed. Judgment and condemnation are very inhibiting forces and we easily slip into them. Occasionally we meet someone who is non-judgmental, who does not come into the world to condemn the world but in order that the world might be saved. What has it been like for you when you met a non-judgmental person? What has it been like for you, and for other people, when you have been able to adopt a non-judgmental approach to them?

Prayer

Merciful and gracious Father, you showed the fullness of your love when you gave your only Son for our salvation and sent down upon us the power of your Spirit. Complete within us the work of your love, that we who have communion in Christ may come to share fully the undying life he lives with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen.

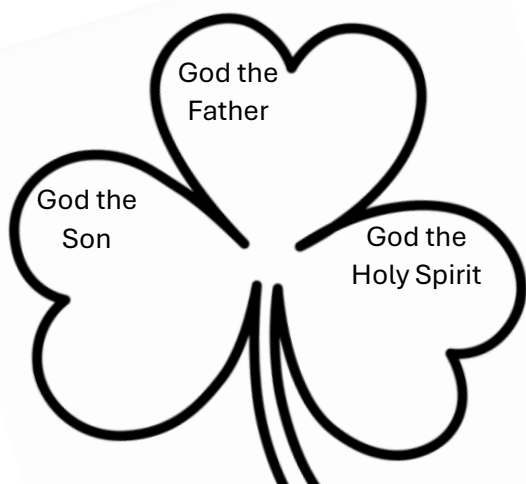
