Church and Refugees – Challenge to Compassion!

12th SUNDAY in
ORDINARY TIME, Yr A

Dear Friends,

World Refugee Week has just concluded with World Refugee Day on June 20. The official theme - A Million Stories – reminds us that Australia is marking the milestone of welcoming over 1,000,000 refugees and humanitarian entrants since the end of World War II. We have a proud record of offering hospitality to those fleeing oppressive regimes, adverse economic situations, and prolonged conflicts, and governments of all persuasions have done just that. Refugees are part of our community here.

The political climate here and across the world is changing, partly due to, among other things, the number of refugees on the move, responses of some governments to those within their borders, and reaction to incidents involving particular racial groups and individual refugees.

Governments and communities need to deal with these issues, but we as Christians need to be guided by the Church's strong teaching and insist on just and humane treatment for all. This message has been reinforced by Pope Leo since his election just over a year ago.

The inherent dignity of every human being is a central tenet of our faith and for this reason, Pope Leo insists that refugees are not 'just numbers or files' and teaches that their basic human worth never decreases simply by crossing a border. His message for the World Day of Migrants and Refugees contained reference to them as 'messengers of hope.'

His denunciation of human traffickers and mafias who prey on migrants and refugees may surprise us but even here in Australia, perhaps in our own neighbourhood or shopping centre, there are people held captive and controlled by traffickers. Governments need to take great care to ensure safer, more humanitarian ways to process refugees and migrants.

The political and economic challenges in this area are real but the message of welcome must spread beyond our local parish community and capture the spirit of Pope Francis' message at WYD in Portugal in 2023:

'In the Church, no one is left out or left over. There is room for everyone. Just the way we are. Everyone. Jesus says this clearly. When he sends the apostles to invite people to the banquet, he tells them: "Go out and bring in everyone", young and old, healthy and infirm, righteous and sinners. Everyone, everyone, everyone! In the Church there is room for everyone... the Church, the Mother of all. There is room for everyone. The Lord does not point a finger, but opens his arms.'

GOSPEL: Matthew 10:26-33

26 Jesus said: "So have no fear of them; for nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing secret that will not become known. 27 What I say to you in the dark, tell in the light; and what you hear whispered, proclaim from the housetops. 28 Do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. 29 Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. 30 And even the hairs of your head are all counted. 31 So do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows. 32 "Everyone therefore who acknowledges me before others, I also will acknowledge before my Father in heaven; 33 but whoever denies me before others, I also will deny before my Father in heaven.

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Our times have an air of instability and everyone feels the sense of upheaval and unpredictability. Fear is perfectly understandable. Something similar may be said of our lives as believers. From a "church" point of view, we wonder who will be in church in the coming years and who will preside at the Lord's Supper. From a personal point of view, familiar faith affirmations seem no longer as tenable as they were. And yet, at the centre of the faith project stands not my condition or even my faith, but all that God did for us Jesus' death and resurrection. As Paul exclaims who will (or can) separate us from the love of God in Christ?

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. 'Do not fear' is the unifying theme in this passage which is set in the context of a mission sermon by Jesus, preparing his disciples for what lay ahead. He urges them to have courage in speaking his message and living his message, drawing strength from their trust in the Father whose care for us exceeds his care for hundreds of sparrows. How has trust in God been a source of strength in life for you?
2. The body/soul terminology presupposes an anthropology in which the soul represents one's real self and the body is the perishable shell. For Jesus the important thing is to be true to one's real self, even if this does involve some material or physical loss or pain. When you have had that kind of courage, what was it like for you?
3. There is no such thing as secret discipleship. It is in declaring their allegiance to Jesus that his followers will find life. They will be the losers if they hide their discipleship. Does this resonate with your experience?

PRAYER:

True and faithful God, you give courage to the fearful and endurance to martyrs. Sustain us as followers of your Son Jesus that with boldness and conviction we may acknowledge him before the world. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen.

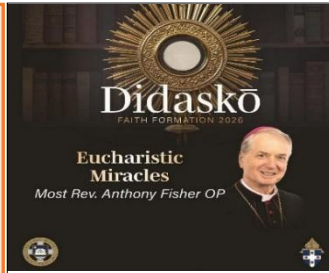

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION FROM THE CHALICE

On the Feast of Corpus Christi, Holy Spirit Parish will reintroduce the option of receiving Holy Communion under both kinds — the Sacred Host and the Precious Blood.

Both adults and children are welcome to receive from the chalice. Children may find this a new experience and may not feel comfortable at first. Parents are encouraged to guide and assist their children as they learn to receive the Lord reverently and worthily.

It is important to remember that according to Catholic teaching, Christ is fully present under either species. Whether we receive only the Sacred Host or receive from both the Host and the Chalice, we receive the whole Christ — His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches:

“Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace.” (CCC 1390)

Receiving from the chalice does not mean receiving more of Christ. Rather, Communion under both kinds offers a fuller sign of the Eucharistic banquet instituted by the Lord at the Last Supper.

How to Receive from the Chalice

If you wish to receive from the chalice:

1. After receiving the Sacred Host, proceed to the minister holding the chalice.
2. The minister will say: **“The Blood of Christ.”**
3. Respond clearly: **“Amen.”**
4. Take the chalice carefully from the minister.
5. Take a small sip from the chalice.
6. Return the chalice to the minister and move away reverently.

A Few Important Reminders

- Receiving from the chalice is optional.
- If you are feeling unwell or have concerns about health, please refrain from receiving from the chalice.
- The faithful are **not permitted to dip the Host into the chalice themselves** (self-intinction).
- Communion by intinction, where the minister dips the Host into the Precious Blood, is **not practised at Holy Spirit Parish.**

Above all, remember that the Eucharist is an encounter with the living Christ, who nourishes us with His love and grace.

As St Augustine reminds us:

“Behold what you are; become what you receive.”
