## Augustinians Gather – ‘One in Mind and Heart!’

Dear Friends,

Augustinians love to gather but it's rare that we can do so as a Province – from different parts of Australia, South Korea, Vietnam, Thailand, Philippines and Rome. One such occasion is our 4-yearly Provincial Chapter which takes place this week at St Augustine's College. Prior General, Most Rev Joseph Farrell OSA (pictured below) will attend as President of the Chapter, along with Assistant General, Very Rev Frederick Commendador OSA. During his years as Prior General, Pope Leo presided over our Chapter a number of times.



Fr Tony Banks OSA will be installed as Provincial on Monday and members of the Provincial Council elected later in the week. A key focus of the Chapter will be to review the program adopted 4 years ago and assess how well we are living Augustinian Community Life, our faithfulness to the charism of the Order, our commitment to the Mission of the Church and our diverse ministries. The Augustinians present will discern where we go from here. St Clair parishioner Rachael Kama, Asia-Pacific

representative on the Order's International Commission for Laity, will attend some sessions.

Chapters are not just about electing leaders, making decisions and legislating norms. They also promote the spiritual and apostolic vitality of Augustinians. Community life is always on our agenda because it both expresses and nourishes who we are as followers of St Augustine and it determines our effectiveness in ministry. Somewhere along the way, we need to go back to the basics – the Rule of St Augustine, our basic guide to Augustinian community life but also a useful resource for family life and our school and pastoral ministries. We usually begin at the beginning:

*'Before all else, dear brothers and sisters, love God and then your neighbor, because these are the chief commandments given to us... The main purpose for your having come together is to live harmoniously in your house, intent upon God in oneness of mind and heart.'* (Chapter 1)

Augustinians come in various shapes and sizes! So far I haven't met any with tattoos though there is the occasional distinctive hair style. We come from different backgrounds too – teachers, merchant banker, the military, flight cabin crew, butchering and nursing. In the US, I studied with former US Marines and more recently was on an Order Commission with an Augustinian who had worked for US Government intelligence as a spy!

As an Augustinian, I find incredible strength in this great array of holiness in the Order and wider Church – **saintly and ordinary** is the Augustinian Way. Please keep us in your prayers during the coming week.

## Whoever finds his life will lose it; whoever loses his life will find it

### GOSPEL: Matthew 10:37-42

37 [Jesus said:] "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. 38 And whoever does not take up his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. 39 Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life because of me will find it.

40 "Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me. 41 Whoever receives a prophet in the name of a prophet will receive a prophet's reward. Whoever receives a righteous person in the name of a righteous person will receive a righteous person's reward. 42 And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones in the name of a disciple, I tell you the truth, he will never lose his reward."

### THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

We do have the saying, "goodness is its own reward" and that, no doubt, is true. We don't do good to be rewarded but simply because it is good. At the same time, goodness leads to goodness and kindness inspires kindness. This can be true at the most mundane level: if I am courteous and obliging, say, as a driver, perhaps others on the road will be inspired to be obliging and courteous in their turn. It is even more true at a higher level. Generosity of spirit inspires the same in others.

### POINTERS FOR PRAYER

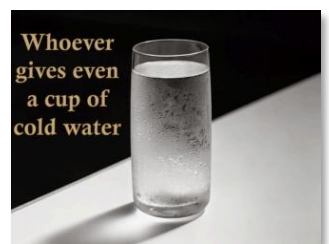
1. Jesus never wanted suffering for anyone but he knew that if anyone was going to follow in his footsteps promoting love and respect for every person, they would meet with opposition. Fidelity has its price, but also rewards. Would you agree?
2. The passage is a call to both radical and practical discipleship. When have you found that in order to achieve a certain objective you had to make it a priority, and then take the practical steps necessary to reach your goal? What were the benefits to you when you did this?
3. 'Hate' (in the Lucan version) is prophetic exaggeration for the uncompromising loyalty Jesus seeks in disciples. There may be times when people make demands in conflict with fidelity to another relationship. This can be painful. When have you found that being clear about your priorities helped you in that situation?

All-powerful God, your incarnate Word commands our obedience and offers us true life.

Make our ears attentive to the voice of your Son and our hearts generous in answering his call, that we may take up the cross with trust in his promises.

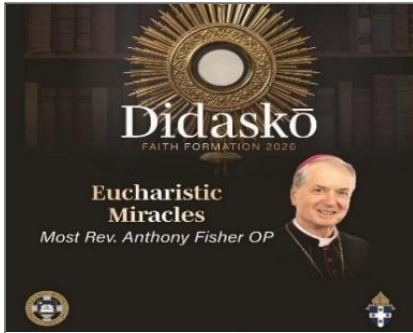

## RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION FROM THE CHALICE

On the Feast of Corpus Christi, Holy Spirit Parish will reintroduce the option of receiving Holy Communion under both kinds — the Sacred Host and the Precious Blood.

Both adults and children are welcome to receive from the chalice. Children may find this a new experience and may not feel comfortable at first. Parents are encouraged to guide and assist their children as they learn to receive the Lord reverently and worthily.

It is important to remember that according to Catholic teaching, Christ is fully present under either species. Whether we receive only the Sacred Host or receive from both the Host and the Chalice, we receive the whole Christ — His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches:

“Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace.” (CCC 1390)

Receiving from the chalice does not mean receiving more of Christ. Rather, Communion under both kinds offers a fuller sign of the Eucharistic banquet instituted by the Lord at the Last Supper.

### How to Receive from the Chalice

If you wish to receive from the chalice:

1. After receiving the Sacred Host, proceed to the minister holding the chalice.
2. The minister will say: **“The Blood of Christ.”**
3. Respond clearly: **“Amen.”**
4. Take the chalice carefully from the minister.
5. Take a small sip from the chalice.
6. Return the chalice to the minister and move away reverently.

### A Few Important Reminders

- Receiving from the chalice is optional.
- If you are feeling unwell or have concerns about health, please refrain from receiving from the chalice.
- The faithful are **not permitted to dip the Host into the chalice themselves** (self-intinction).
- Communion by intinction, where the minister dips the Host into the Precious Blood, is **not practised at Holy Spirit Parish.**

Above all, remember that the Eucharist is an encounter with the living Christ, who nourishes us with His love and grace.

As St Augustine reminds us:

**“Behold what you are; become what you receive.”**
