NATSICC – ‘Walking Together in Christ – 40 Years On!’

Dear Friends,

This week we celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday as we come together across Australia to mark National Reconciliation Week and celebrate the gifts of Australia’s First Peoples in the Catholic Church. The Augustinians are no strangers to the importance of reaching out to our indigenous people, having ministered in North Queensland for many years and pioneered language and study support programs in Redfern and Emerton through Augustinian Volunteers Australia.

Our Nation is experiencing a time of tension as some political bodies debate the place of migrants and refugees in Australian society, a discussion that sometimes extends to our First Nations Peoples and the use of the Welcome to or Acknowledgement of Country. By sheer chance, our Diocesan Synod in 2023 coincided with the Referendum on the Voice to Parliament and some tensions were evident at that time as the Church in Parramatta discerned its Pastoral Plan 2024-2028.

Our Diocese is home to the largest urban population of First Nations peoples in Australia. Accordingly, the Pastoral Plan acknowledges the wisdom and learning that the First Nations peoples share with us and reflects on being a Welcoming Church and the need to reach out to those on the margins. Many comments include First Nations peoples even when not mentioning them specifically.

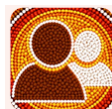
Significantly, this year marks 40 years since Pope St John Paul II addressed Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples in Alice Springs on 29 November 1986 – and in doing so spoke to the whole of the Church in Australia and to our Nation as well:

‘You are part of Australia and Australia is part of you. And the Church herself in Australia will not be fully the Church that Jesus wants her to be until you have made your contribution to her life and until that contribution has been joyfully received by others.’

Those present recall how: *‘a wind storm picked up the red soil from the Earth and swirled it amongst our people. The dust seemed to intertwine with the words of love, hope and empathy. The message touched our souls and it touched our skin. Never before had we felt so welcome in the house of Jesus.’*

When a Diocese opts to be an *Inclusive and Welcoming Church*, a *Humble and Healing Church*, a *Listening Church*, a *Church Renewed in Spirit and Prayer*, a *Church That Reaches to the Margins*, and a *Church Walking Together*, the challenge will be significant.... But then that’s the Gospel – it speaks all languages. It esteems and embraces all cultures.... It uplifts and enriches cultures with the revealed message of a loving and merciful God.

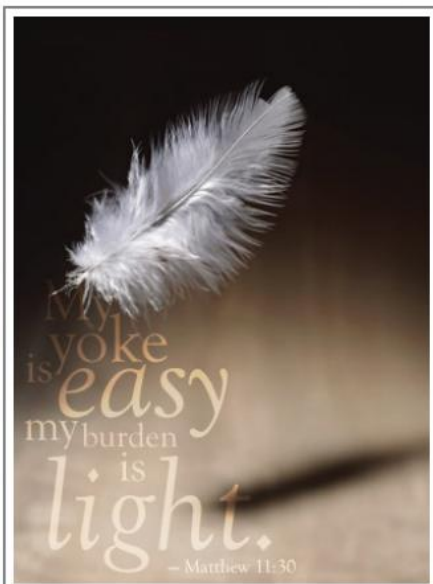

Matt 11:28 "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. 29 Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. 30 For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

The Lord understands us and knows us better than we know ourselves. O Lord, you have searched me and known me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away. You search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways. (Psalm 139:1-3) He knows of what we are made and so we can come confidently before him with our brokenness and need of his grace. It might be good during Mass today to become aware of whatever is a burden to me now in my life and ask the Lord for his love and healing touch.

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. Human beings are always setting up barriers which divide people into those who are important and those who are not. It happens in every community and Jesus met it among the Jewish people of his time. God wants to break down these barriers so that those who are on the wrong side of them can experience that they too are his children and have a unique contribution to make to their community. Perhaps you can recall someone whom you did not think of highly but who turned out to be very good in some sphere. What good news that you were wrong?
2. Great intelligence is not sufficient to develop a relationship with God, unless combined with an open childlike capacity to wonder. Does this resonate with your experience?
3. The ministry of Jesus was to introduce people to a relationship of intimacy with God. How has Jesus given you that kind of relationship?
4. Another aspect of the ministry of Jesus was to free people from the burden of a legalistic understanding of religion, and to introduce them to a faith marked by freedom and love. Perhaps you have made that journey also. Who has been a Jesus person for you and helped you to find freedom, joy and rest in your faith?



PRAYER

Father, Lord of heaven and earth, by whose gracious will the mysteries of the kingdom are revealed to the childlike, make us learn from your Son humility of heart, that in shouldering his yoke we may find refreshment and rest. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen

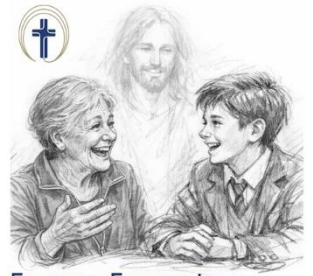

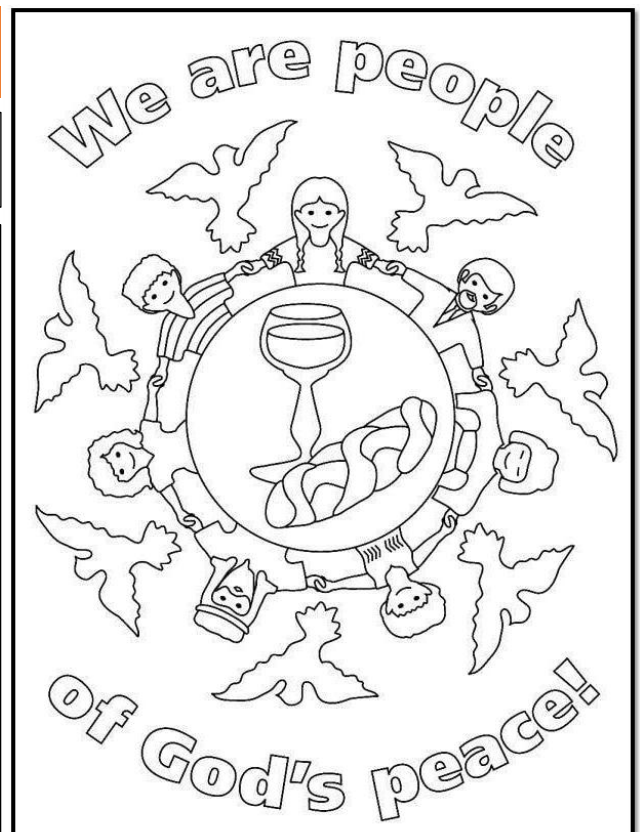
