Ways to Holiness – 'Loving Truthfully!'

Dear Friends,

Last Sunday, God's word focused on the strong imagery of planting and growth; this Sunday's readings reflect on the human condition and God's patient understanding, leniency and forgiveness. Our second reading, again from Romans 8, moves on from its dynamic description of creation '*groaning in one great act of giving birth*' to the generous image of God's Spirit expressing our prayer when we struggle to put our needs into words, interceding for us and making up for our inadequacy when it comes to praying.

We so easily fill up our lives with activities and things to the extent that even God is challenged to find a space. St Augustine had a similar experience, though he does admit that God was always there, expressed in the familiar passage in his Confessions Book 10, 27:

'I have learned to love you late, Beauty at once so ancient and so new! I have learned to love you late! You were within me, and I was in the world outside myself. I searched for you outside myself and, disfigured as I was, I fell upon the lovely things of your creation. You were with me, but I was not with you.'

That passage certainly strikes a chord with me but I find comfort in the fact that the Spirit never deserts us but maintains that sense of 'desire' within each of us, that longing for a deeper meaning to life, a kind of homesickness for God interwoven with our lives. Our challenge is '*to love truthfully*' – God's grace is always there for us! Our personal or spiritual groaning reflects our need to, as Augustine puts it, '*return to our heart*', and find both ourselves and Christ.

Farming images dominate this week's Gospel, again about seeds and the growth of the wheat and the weeds, yet another life image of the imperfections in us and in others. Just as nature groans, we groan too as we take the hard journey of the Cross in all its forms and wait to be set free. Our lives contain both sowing and groaning. Fr Michael Fallon MSC comments on Romans 8:



'This yearning and groaning finds expression in prayer... the same Spirit, the Spirit of the one to whom they belong, comes to their aid, in their weakness and in their ignorance, and prays in them.'

(The Letters of Paul – A Commentary p 297)

The practice of prayer should never be a grind for us but rather the means through which the whole universe is caught up in one magnificent hymn of praise and thanks to God

The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field

GOSPEL: Matthew 13:24-43

24 Jesus put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field; 25 but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away. 26 So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well. 27 And the slaves of the householder came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?' 28 He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' The slaves said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' 29 But he replied, 'No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them. 30 Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn.'" Matt 13:31 He put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; 32 it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches." Matt 13:33 He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened." Matt 13:34 Jesus told the crowds all these things in parables; without a parable he told them nothing. 35 This was to fulfil what had been spoken through the prophet: "I will open my mouth to speak in parables; I will proclaim what has been hidden from the foundation of the world." Matt 13:36 Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples approached him, saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." 37 He answered, "The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man; 38 the field is the world, and the good seed are the children of the kingdom; the weeds are the children of the evil one, 39 and the enemy who sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. 40 Just as the weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. 41 The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, 42 and they will throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. 43 Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let anyone with ears listen!

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Again, today we have two versions of the one parable, the original and a later church interpretation or reception. Communities of faith are always "mixed," in that some people are fully engaged, some are half-hearted and many, perhaps most, are somewhere in between. What to do? The temptation to go for a radical, purified church has been a recurring one across history. The teaching of this parable is let things alone—it is not for us to judge. It could be (we hope!) that less committed believers may change, and a welcoming, compassionate approach may enable that to happen.

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. The owner of the field who allowed the wheat and the darnel to grow together is a reminder to us to be patient with ourselves and with others when we see everything is not right. Sometimes a preoccupation with the negative (the darnel) can blind us to seeing the positive in our own lives and in the lives of others. When have you found that a willingness to live with the messiness of the present created the conditions for future growth?
2. Have you ever found that it was through accepting the darnel that you learned important lessons for life, e.g., learning by making mistakes, or asking stupid questions, or taking foolish risks?
3. The parables of the mustard seed and the leaven are reminders that seemingly insignificant things can have very positive results. Have you ever been surprised by the benefit to yourself or others of a kind gesture, a small initiative, or a word of encouragement?

PRAYER

O God, patient and forbearing, you alone know fully the goodness of what you have made. Strengthen our spirit when we are slow and temper our zeal when we are rash, that in your own good time you may produce in us a rich harvest from the seed you have sown and tended.

We make our prayer through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen.
