An Understanding Heart – ‘Recognising our life signs!’

Dear Friends,

What gift do we want most from God at this time – one thing only? That’s a tough question, so let’s take our cue from Solomon in the first reading from 1 Kings 3; he asked for an **‘understanding heart’** so he could discern between good and evil. That may sound a bit dry and boring, but it’s really **‘common sense’** by another name and opens up broad perspectives on our living.

During these current Sundays, Jesus is putting before us a variety of Gospel parables that use simple life situations to illustrate what the Kingdom of God is like – hidden treasure, fine pearls, a net full of fish. Planting and harvesting have been prominent themes too, breaking open the meaning of the Kingdom, the Reign of God – signs that feed our **understanding heart**.

While this is something we should earnestly desire, or at least be open to accepting, we may think to ourselves, *‘I’m rather busy at the moment, remind me later!’* - when it’s more convenient... when I retire and have more time... when the children are grown... Yet the Kingdom is the divine gift that impacts on everything that happens in our lives.

We need to cultivate a habit of **‘reflectiveness’** and list the **‘signs’** of the Kingdom in our personal lives. These may include our desire for our family life to be stable, our children safe, our employment steady. Even when things go badly for us, we need to hold on to the signs that keep us hopeful and write our own parables of the Kingdom on these **‘life signs’**. Underlying each authentic parable is the reality of a God who is generous, inclusive and impartial, the God who patiently gives us time here and now to heal our lives.

Just as Jesus chose our human condition as the setting for revealing the beauty of God and the nobility of our humanness, so we choose to read the **‘signs of the times’** in light of the Gospel and read too the **‘signs of our lives’** in order to understand what God is expecting of us. The human journey to the Kingdom need not be postponed because it’s about good living, accepting God’s gifts, being aware of and involved in the Church, and discovering the presence of God in the everyday.

The kingdom of heaven: a treasure, a pearl, a net

GOSPEL: Matthew 13:44-52

44 [Jesus said:] "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field.

45 "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; 46 on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it.

47 "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea and caught fish of every kind; 48 when it was full, they drew it ashore, sat down, and put the good into baskets but threw out the bad. 49 So it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous 50 and throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

51 "Have you understood all this?" They answered, "Yes." 52 And he said to them, "Therefore every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like the master of a household who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old."

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Our conviction is that God loves us wholly, in the double sense that he loves us fully and completely and his desire is that grace should touch every dimension of our lives. Anyone who has made the discovery of faith, like the merchant in search of fine pearls, will know what is meant: it is so wonderful that it leads to a discipleship costing not less than everything. It can be daunting, of course, but it leads to life in abundance (Jn 10:10).

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. Have you ever found yourself saying "that was worth it" after giving up something (time, pleasure, money, etc.)? What was the treasure that made the sacrifice worthwhile?
2. The "kingdom of heaven" is when God is really the ruler in our life. What treasures have you obtained when you allow God to be at the centre of your life?
3. In life, we gather a lot of things, some good and some bad. The wise person in the kingdom of heaven, knows how to sit down and make decisions on what to keep and what to discard. When have you undertaken that kind of discernment? What have you discarded? What have you retained?

PRAYER

God of eternal wisdom, you alone impart the gift of right judgement. Grant us an understanding ear, that we may value wisely the treasure of your kingdom and gladly forgo all lesser gifts to possess that kingdom's incomparable joy.

We make our prayer through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen.

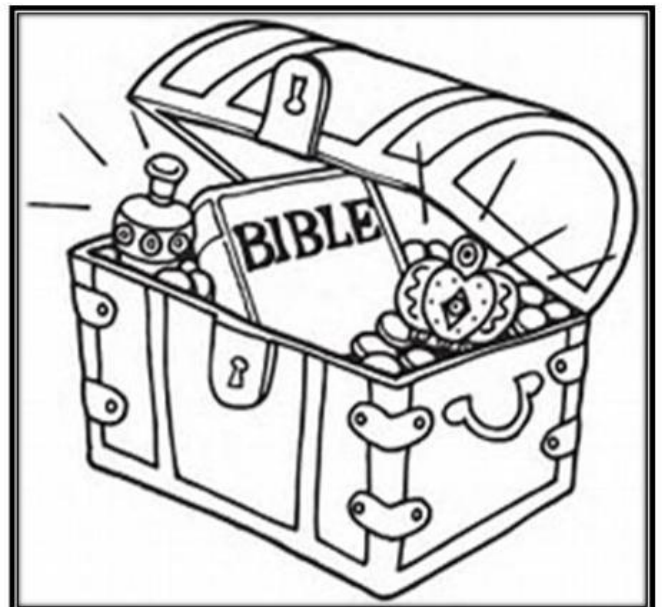
