The Grace of Vocation - 'What's in a Name?'

Dear Friends,

This past Sunday, we blessed our family members on the annual *World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly*, established by Pope Francis in 2021 around the time of the recent feast of Mary's parents Joachim and Anne – a timely reminder of the place of family members of different ages in our lives. Time and again, I meet 'new' grandparents who are discovering a fresh life as their first grandchild is born and they embrace a new 'vocation' as it were.

As we begin Vocations Awareness Week, this is a reminder that every one of us has a *personal vocation* – our call to be who we are, our identity, family, nationality, religious faith – before any choice of a lifestyle vocation in the single, married or committed religious state. Each is called to live a life of commitment, love and grace in the vocation of our choice. Grace touches each of us through our extended family, parish and wider community – young, old, married, single, widowed, separated, divorced, religious or priest – each called to make a difference through generous love and outreach to family, community and Church.

National Vocations Awareness Week this year is being celebrated from 2-9 August and always coincides with the Feast of Australia's first saint, St Mary of the Cross MacKillop (8 August) and the Patron Saint of Priests, St John Vianney (4 August). For many years we focused on the Vocations of Marriage and the Single Life on the first Sunday and on Religious Life and Priesthood on the second. This is certainly helpful but we need to maintain a broad view of the diverse ways we live our Christian calling across the full spectrum of human activity where God's grace colours our life experience.

Much of the focus is on young people as they discern life directions and deal with the uncertainties of making the right choices. The fact is that, at every age, our personal lives will consist of a range of opportunities and experiences that few of us could even imagine – all within the general direction of our basic choice.

A timely quote from St Mary MacKillop reminds us of our essential call – '*Never see a need without doing something about it!*' This is a good fit for today's Gospel. The context is just after the death of John the Baptist. Jesus and the disciples are mourning his loss, needing time to be alone, to pray, share memories and process their grief. Their time was interrupted by their need to feed 5,000 hungry people by providing, out of their own resources – a timely reminder to us to be alert to the call of grace in our lives too – our vocation! Life can change in a flash!

The feeding of the five thousand

GOSPEL: Matthew 14:13-21

Now when Jesus heard this, he withdrew from there in a boat to a deserted place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves." Jesus said to them, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." They replied, "We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish." And he said, "Bring them here to me." Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

In the Gospels, "compassion" is used in a way which is restricted and instructive. Compassion is used only of Jesus himself or of God in some of the parables. The word itself means something like mercy, arising from deep within, a kind of spontaneous empathy and understanding, the kind of reaction a woman has for the child of her womb. When people are compassionate to us, it is because we need it, and usually we are deeply touched and grateful. Such is our God! If we receive such compassion, we are obliged to give it in return, of course. This is the charter of Christian living.

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. The news of the death of John the Baptist prompted Jesus to go off to be alone, but the crowds followed him. Despite his personal sorrow, he was able to reach out in compassion to the crowd. Perhaps there have been times when you have put personal preferences and desires to one side in order to reach out to another. What was it like for you when you were able to do this?
2. When Jesus saw the crowd, he recognised their need and reached out to them. Who has been a Jesus person for you, someone who recognised your need and reached out to you? For whom have you been a Jesus person?
3. The scene is a Eucharistic symbol reminding us of the sacred meal to which all believers are invited to receive nourishment from the Lord. How has the Eucharist been a source of nourishment for you?
4. When the disciples became aware of the problem, they wanted to send the crowd away, but Jesus told them, "You give them something to eat". They thought what they had was insufficient, but Jesus used the little they had to feed the crowd. When we give the little we have to a situation, the results are often beyond our expectations. Have you had this experience?
5. "Lord, it is an extraordinary thing: if we complain about the little we have, we never have enough; but if we take what we have, raise our eyes to heaven, and say the blessing over it, we have as much as we want, and even twelve baskets of scraps of leftovers." *Michel de Verteuil*

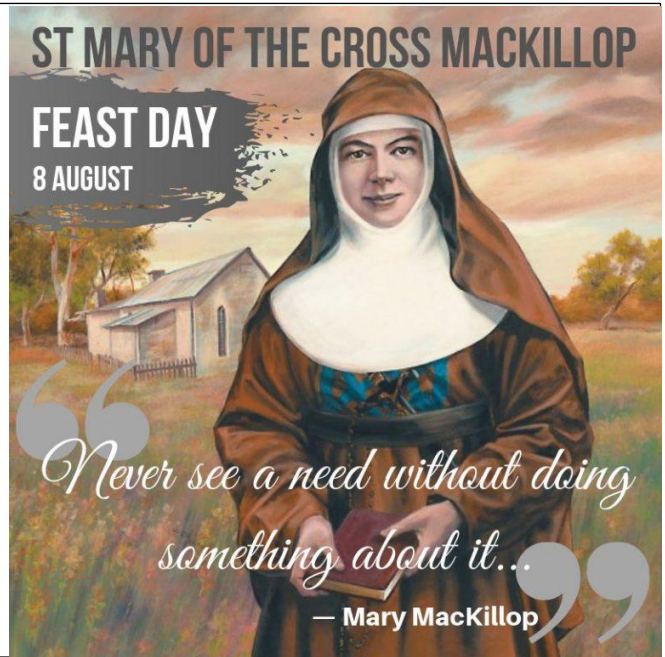

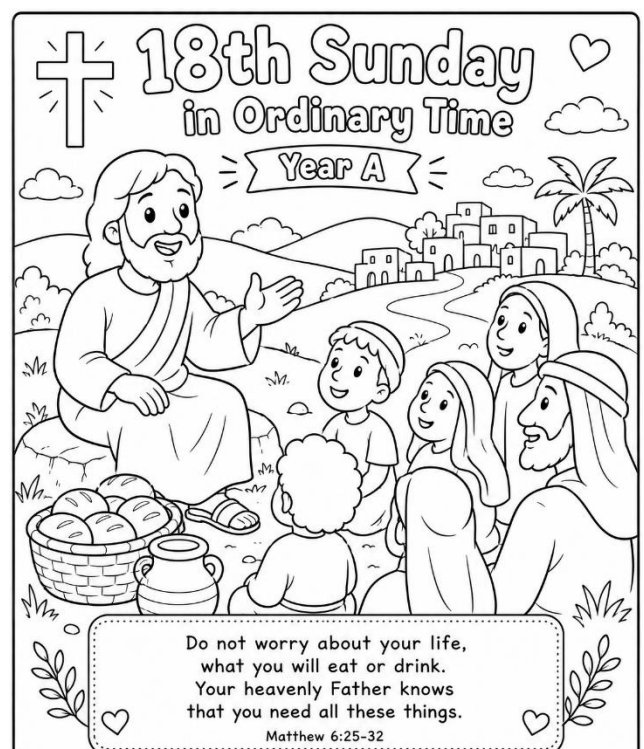
