Vocation – 'Keeping the Doors Open!'

Dear Friends,

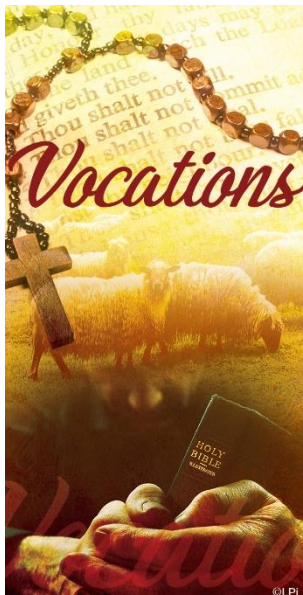
This Sunday we focus on vocations to Priesthood, Diaconate and Religious Life, and we reflect on the kind of Church that the Lord wants us to be – narrow, introverted and defensive or open, inclusive and joyful – a Church where the doors are open, and we are willing to listen.

Pope Francis once described the Church's call '*to be the house of the Father, with doors always wide open*' (Evangelii Gaudium n 47). Baptism is '*the door*', he says, and '*The Eucharist, although it is the fullness of sacramental life, is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak.*' There should be a place for everyone.

In Pope Francis, a Jesuit and Pope Leo, an Augustinian, we have models of priesthood and religious life. Priesthood, Diaconate and Religious Life, even though quite different vocations, are about Service. We serve people in a variety of ways - attending to their pastoral needs and witnessing through a life of prayer. Some religious give witness through a life of prayer and contemplation - Benedictine Sisters, Carmelites and Cistercians excel at the latter.

Of course, these vocations can be 'dangerous' vocations, particularly if they become identified with privilege. Pope Francis repeatedly encouraged priests and bishops to avoid clericalism and material excesses and live simply. Pope Leo stresses these same values and prioritises social justice and respect for human rights. The 'power' in the priesthood should be the power of the human Jesus who met people where they were at, was sensitive to the burdens they carried, and sought to lift these burdens from their shoulders.

At an ordination ceremony some years ago, Bishop Vincent Long described how the Priesthood has lost some of its 'aura' in recent times, for reasons with which we are all very familiar. Every Christian, including priests, deacons and men and women religious, need to show forth the positive, hopeful face of the Church – like Filipino Cardinal Tagle. God works his miracles through every vocation.



I once concelebrated Mass with the 'smiling' Cardinal at the Basilica of Santo Nino in Cebu. The Cardinal shared some humorous stories which, unfortunately, I cannot share with you as they were in Tagalog!!

Our primary vocation is to follow Christ and to be his fully human and loving presence in the world. Our roles and functions in the Church are different and complementary, and so we must honour all Christian vocations without the need to rank them in order of importance. Pope Francis again - '*Everyone can share in some way in the life of the Church; everyone can be part of the community*' (EV n 47).

A final question.... Have we the courage to suggest to our young people that they consider priesthood or religious life?

Command me to come to you over the water

Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side while he would send the crowds away. After sending the crowds away he went up into the hills by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, while the boat, by now far out on the lake, was battling with a heavy sea, for there was a head-wind. In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified. 'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear. But at once Jesus called out to them, saying, 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' It was Peter who answered. 'Lord,' he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.' 'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink. 'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped. The men in the boat bowed down before him and said, 'Truly, you are the Son of God.'

Leo's Lens - REFLECTION by Nick Brodie

Approaching the frightened apostles who were struggling in darkness upon the water, Jesus tells them to be courageous. In tempestuous times, Pope Leo also calls us to have courage for 'building a world in which everyone can flourish'. Pursuit of the Common Good is, he intimates, a courageous calling.

We all 'are called to unite listening and courage, prayer and responsibility, so that,' the Pope says, 'the human city may become a more fitting place to live.'

Reminding us that insistent and consistent courage is important when facing massive change as we are now, for instance, the Pope wants to have courage to consider the true ethics of artificial intelligence. Mimicry of human values is not enough. Rather, the whole development and use of AI must serve 'shared standards of social justice'. Each of us should take up the challenge to make this tremendous innovation in human life work for justice.

Sometimes, courage means embracing or driving change. The pope *encourages* us – see the word *courage* in the middle? – to reflect on how truly courageous men and women helped history truly progress. He especially reminds us of people who 'contributed to making history more humane.' That is the kind of courage Jesus surely wants us to exhibit now.

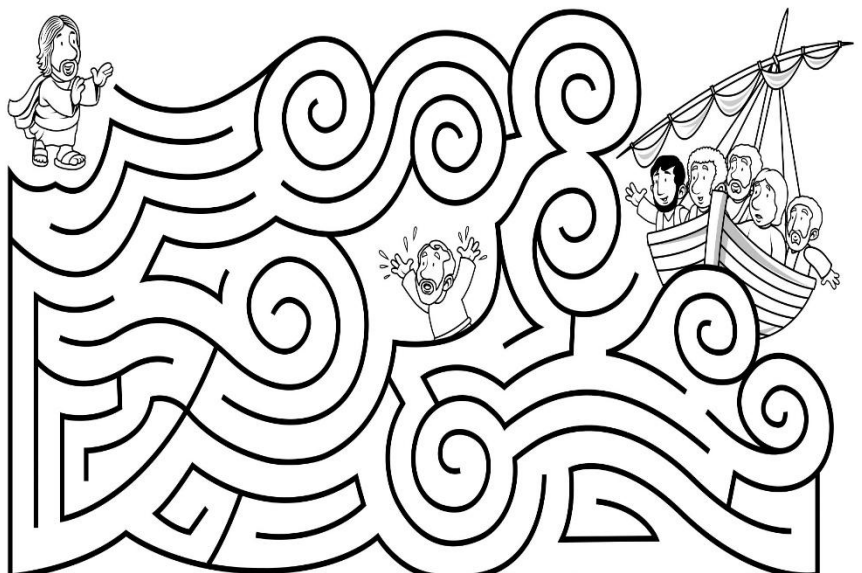
