The Assumption - 'Success of the Grace of Christ!'

Dear Friends,

It isn't often that a Solemnity of Mary falls on or close to Sunday. The celebration of Mary's Assumption yesterday is fresh in our minds and an opportunity to reflect on the great gift we have in Mary, Mother of Jesus.

When nations host the Olympics or the Commonwealth Games, we focus if just for a brief time on the tenacity of the human spirit among the participants in both victory and defeat. Even then, we cannot escape our history. During the 2021 Olympics in Japan, the 76th anniversaries of the bombings of Hiroshima (6 August) and Nagasaki (9 August) gave us pause to reflect on how our history needs healing. Today, our world faces more challenges in the Middle East, Israel, Gaza, Lebanon, Iran and Ukraine – to name a few.

Memories like these are not lost on the Church because we cannot exist in a protected bubble aside from the events that affect people's lives. The proclamation of the dogma of the Assumption in 1950 by Pope Pius XII, soon after World War II, reflects this awareness and affirmation of the preciousness of all human life. Mary, the mother of Jesus, had completed her human and baptismal identity by being assumed bodily into heaven - a belief held by the Church for many hundreds of years.

As our world struggles with the value of human life even now, the Church proclaims Mary as a sign of the dignity of every human being, one 'assumed body and soul into heavenly glory'. The Assumption is an Easter Feast which promises that each of us with our struggles and weaknesses, our joys and hopes will share in the life, death and resurrection of her divine Son.

Devotion to Mary is important but it needs to bond us with the Mary Jesus knew as his Mother, neither an idealised other-worldly being nor a woman ground down by daily problems. Mary is a figure of hope in our day, one who trusted God. Irish Scripture scholar Fr Kieran O'Mahony OSA offers the following reflection on Mary's Assumption:



'While we are used to thinking of Mary as enjoying exceptional privileges as a human being, on this day what happened to her, being in God's presence as a whole human being, prefigures our future as well. So this is a feast which looks backwards to the grace Mary enjoyed, but also forward to our own future in God's presence. We too, we believe, will stand before God with all the saints, fully present to God. Even if we cannot really picture such a future, we believe nevertheless in a God who loves all that we are, our bodies, our relationships, our history, our engagement in the real world.'

In these days, let us pray for her intercession using the titles that are most special to us... and answer thoughtfully - **'Pray for us.'**

*Woman, you have great faith.***Matthew 15:21-28**

Jesus left Gennesaret and withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. Then out came a Canaanite woman from that district and started shouting, 'Sir, Son of David, take pity on me. My daughter is tormented by a devil.' But he answered her not a word. And his disciples went and pleaded with him. 'Give her what she wants,' they said 'because she is shouting after us.' He said in reply, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.' But the woman had come up and was kneeling at his feet. 'Lord,' she said 'help me.' He replied, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs.' She retorted, 'Ah yes, sir; but even house-dogs can eat the scraps that fall from their master's table.' Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted.' And from that moment her daughter was well again.

Gospel Reflection by Greg Sunter

This week's gospel provides a fascinating illustration of Jesus' response to those in need. Jesus has travelled to the area of Tyre and Sidon – part of modern day Lebanon. He was physically removing himself from the place of his very active ministry and taking a break. When the Canaanite woman approaches Jesus and his disciples, she is an interruption; a nuisance. Jesus is very abrupt with her. He tells her simply that his ministry is to the house of Israel – the Jews – and is not for her. But the woman is persistent and again asks Jesus to help her. Jesus is even more abrupt and tells her that it is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs. Through this use of metaphor, Jesus refers to the children of Israel (the Jews) and to the gentiles and pagans – sometimes referred to as 'dogs' to reflect their lowly status in the eyes of the Jewish tradition. Still the woman persists and turns Jesus' metaphor back on him, saying that even the dogs get to eat the scraps that fall from the table.

The woman's persistence and faith pay off. Jesus is moved by her faith and through that faith heals the woman's daughter. Despite his initial abruptness and reluctance, Jesus responds with compassion to the woman's request. It is as though she needed to demonstrate that she was really serious and that she did in fact believe that Jesus could make a difference in her life and the life of her daughter. This is an important story in Matthew's gospel. This gospel was written predominantly for Jewish Christians but this story reveals that the ministry of Jesus and the reign of God is open to anyone who believes.

Table Talk – Reflection Questions

1. *Why do you think Jesus first responded to the woman in the way he did?*
2. *What turned Jesus' attitude around?*
3. *What do you think the woman was thinking/feeling as she approached Jesus?*
4. *What message would the followers of Jesus have taken from this event?*
5. *What is the message of this Gospel passage for us today?*

This arrangement has been endorsed by the Regional Vicar for India, Fr. Wilson Injarapu OSA. Ministry appointments for 2027-2030 for the Australian Province are expected to be announced in October and it is anticipated that Fr Saju will continue serving in the Province beyond 2026.
