SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY – 'Living the Gospel in Times of Social Division'

Dear Friends,

This year Australia's Catholic Bishops have taken an unprecedented step of issuing 2 Social Justice Statements – one in February on the cost of living and the current one on ways to make Australia a more cohesive society - Living the Gospel in Times of Social Division.

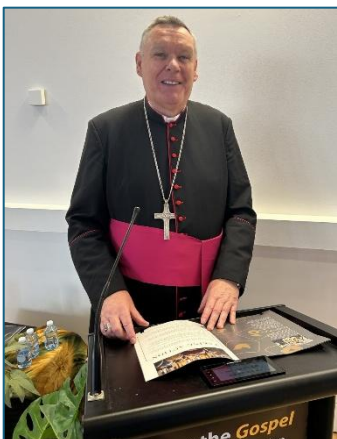
Our recent experience in response to the Hamas atrocity against Israel in October 2023, the subsequent loss of life in Gaza and elsewhere, and the growth of Antisemitism, Islamophobia and other forms of racism in our country, including abuse directed to First Nations Peoples, migrants and refugees, are of grave concern.

For Australia, the Bondi Beach attack of December 2025 was a pivotal event. As well, protests are increasingly characterised by anger, vitriol and vilification. We have become too familiar with the expression 'hate speech' and the resulting division that spreads very quickly online. At times, the tone of our political conversation has deteriorated too.

Bishops' Social Justice Commission Chair Bishop Tim Harris (pictured) highlights the Church's key role in building a culture of listening and inclusion: 'Our starting point is the conviction that every person is created in the image and likeness of God and possesses an inherent dignity that can never be diminished by race, religion, culture, language or background... The Church serves society best when it creates spaces where people can encounter one another as neighbours rather than strangers.'

Conference President, Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB writes, 'This statement invites us to see our current social climate as an opportunity to witness to the Gospel... We offer Jesus and the hope born of his death and resurrection. When we choose forgiveness over enmity, hospitality over isolation and solidarity over vilification, we help to create the conditions in which a more peaceful society can prosper.'

The statement proposes a range of actions to build social cohesion, which it argues can only come through practising a 'culture of encounter', in doing so, encouraging people to 'lower the temperature'. This is not a stance of weakness but one of respect for others' differences. Listening and inclusion are crucial but do not require us to agree on every issue. We need to recognise the dignity of those with whom we disagree – both a personal challenge for us and an institutional challenge for our political leaders and news media.



Pope Leo encourages a civilisation of love: a society where justice and charity belong together, and where love guides our economic, political and cultural life. He urges us to be mindful of what we say and what we write. The way we communicate is of fundamental importance. Belligerent and aggressive words, laden with prejudice or spoken in anger, are surely the enemies of what is truly good. We have a real opportunity to contribute to the common good each time we speak the truth.

Matthew 16:21-27

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord,' he said. 'This must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'

REFLECTION by Fr. Michael Tate

We have to get one terrible thought out of our heads, i.e. that the Heavenly Father of Jesus *wanted* him to suffer a tortured, agonising death. Yet we do say: 'It was necessary that Jesus suffer and die.' What can this mean? I believe this refers to the necessity of divine mission and the necessity of divine love.

First, it *was* the Father's will that Jesus remain true to the mission to preach and embody the gospel of mercy and forgiveness. It was inevitable that powerful elites would find this intolerable and have Jesus eliminated. Secondly, God so loved the world where death ravages human beings, that God determined to absorb the suffering and pangs of death.

The temptation to avoid that dreadful necessity lead Jesus to rebuke Peter: 'Get *behind* me, Satan', a terrible variation of the initial call: 'Come, *follow* me.'

We could pause for a moment to very consciously make the sign of the Cross, the consequence of Jesus' mission and love for us.

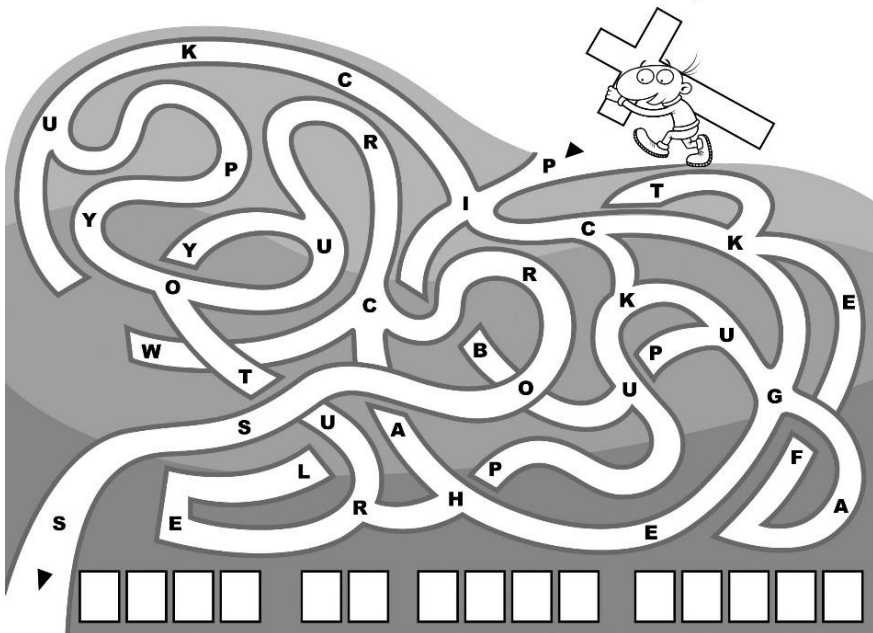

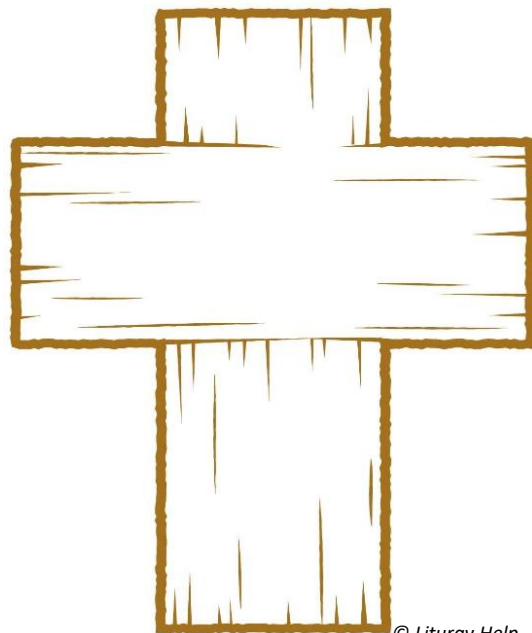
