LEST WE FORGET CATHOLIC SOCIAL JUSTICE TEACHING

Dear Friends,

As Church, we sometimes walk a fine line in society when we witness to Social Justice - a priority for Pope Leo as he discerns the best way to keep the teaching of Jesus before the minds of all in a world searching for a way forward characterised by peace and harmony.

Whenever we face adverse circumstances, we look for ways to fix things. The daily circumstances of our lives are enough – nurturing family bonds, living our faith, looking after the aged, keeping a steady job, coping with health challenges.... and on it goes.

Our country and our world face a range of different challenges at this time and it's easy to fall prey to populist, political ideas when emotions run high. The core principles of Catholic Social Teaching call us to be faithful to the Gospel in everyday life, expressing Jesus' teaching on love of neighbour in Matthew 25:37-40 that any act of love of neighbour is done to Him.

The following principles reflect the teaching of Popes and Church Councils:

Life and Dignity of the Human Person - The Church is committed to the sacredness of all human life and the dignity of the human person and expects those who govern to respect this ideal and enshrine it in law. The Church holds strong views on protection of life before birth and at end-of-life, the death penalty, and the targeting of civilians in war and peacetime, to name a few areas.

Call to Family, Community, and Participation - Family is our central social institution and we are called to support it. Building community is not just a religious act but a fundamental goal of every society as it promotes participation and the wellbeing of all people. Governments need to support and strengthen marriage and the family and look out for the needy.

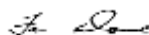
Rights and Responsibilities - Every person has a right to life and to those things they need to live with dignity - food, clothing and shelter - as well as responsibilities to one another and to the wider society. Christians have an obligation to work to protect human rights.

Option for the Poor and Vulnerable - A good measure of the state of a particular society is the way in which it treats its weaker members and the priority it gives to the needs of the poor and marginalised, the rights of workers, and the protection of the environment.

The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers - The Church calls us to protect the basic rights of all workers: the right to productive work, fair wages, private property, and the right to organize and pursue economic opportunity.

Solidarity - Effectively, this means taking seriously the call to 'love our neighbour' and be concerned for his/her welfare both in our immediate environment and globally as well. We must be committed to the common good and pursue justice and peace.

Care for God's Creation - God's creation is where we live and breathe, relate and love, believe and serve. Care for the earth is demanded of us as we protect the planet and all who live here. If we want to follow Jesus, we must live as *people for others* - simply faith in action!

GOSPEL for 25th SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME, YR A

Why are you jealous because I am generous?

Matthew 20:1-16

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first, and the first, last.

GOD'S GRACE - REFLECTION by Fr. Michael Tate

This is a story of the day labourers of Jesus' time. The 'early birds' contracted for the just wage of one denarius and did the hard work over the course of a long day. They were outraged when latecomers also received a denarius. This little parable circulated in the Christian community of the first century because there was great antagonism between the Jews who became followers of Jesus and the non-Jews, the 'Gentiles'. Jewish Christians looked at their long history of hardship preparing for the coming of the Messiah. And now, here were these Gentiles who had done nothing by comparison, and God appeared to be granting them whatever it took to enjoy the 'daily bread' of the Kingdom of God. Jewish Christians had to be shocked out of their idea that God's grace could not be lavished on those outside the boundaries of the Chosen People. We could pause to pray to be taken by happy surprise by those billions of people outside the Church who, by the grace of God, will share with us 'the Bread of Life', given for the salvation of all the world
